Permit Feasibility Planning

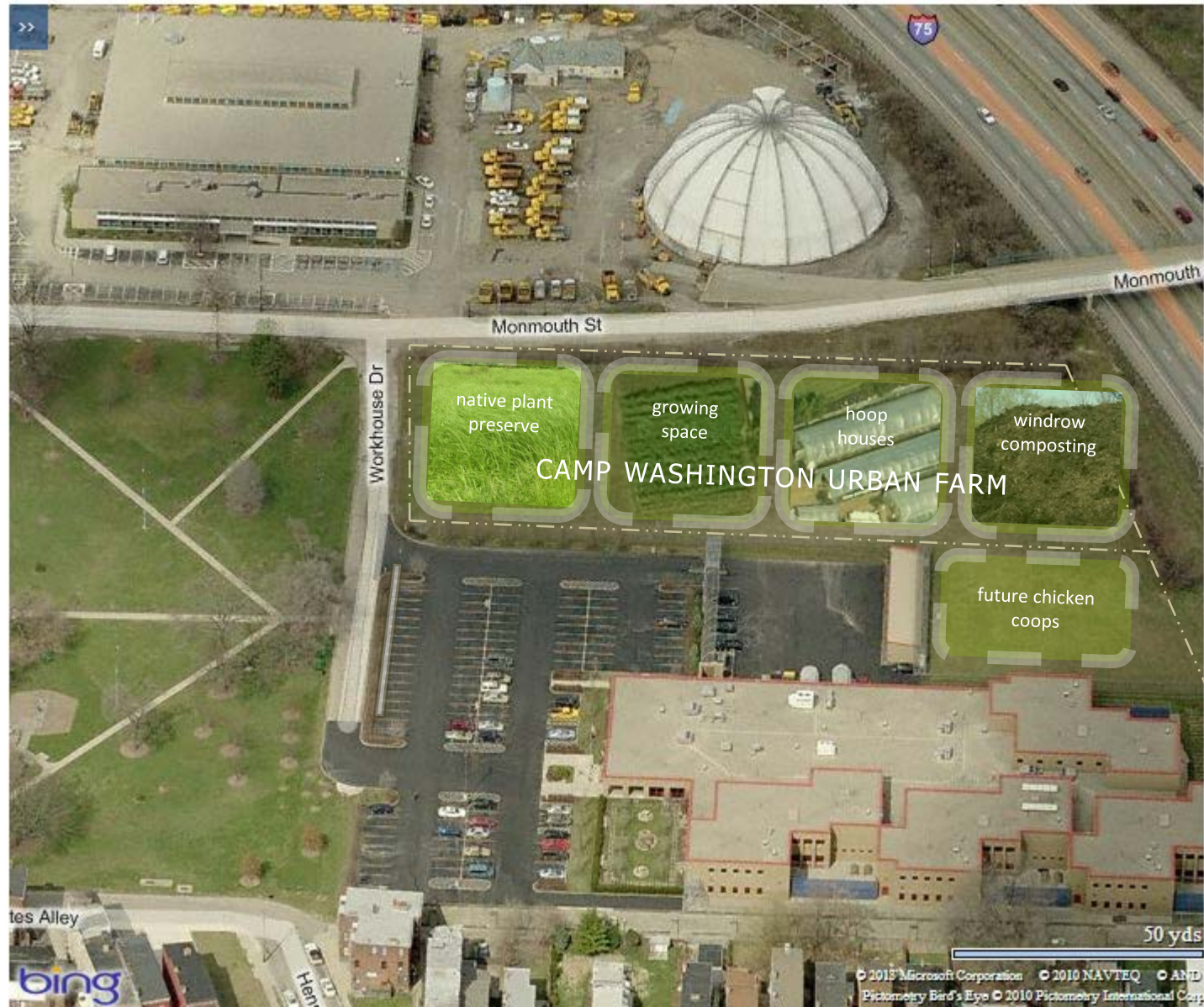
- capacity of parcel for food production and neighborhood development
 - seasonal calendar
 - produce, mulch and ecologic research activities
 - resident groups
- safety and access
 - north security fence: reinforce for adding secure gate
 - farm perimeter fence and camera visibility
 - check-in check-out process
 - extend hose for water service, access for farm equipment
- business training, community involvement, teaching
 - resident training for return as productive citizens
 - harvest fresh food supplement for resident meals
 - prepare food aligned with culinary program, commercial kitchen
 - working farm plots and hoop houses
 - flexibility for future use
 - advancing County sustainability goals
 - advancing MSD goals for water conservation



FIRST STEPS

Permit Feasibility Planning

- permission from County for development for gate and farm beds
- set-up communications structure:
 - River City
 - Hamilton County
 - Camp Washington Community Board
 - m.Arch
- develop programs with River City residents and administration
- set-up timetable, budget and funding (private sources) for building infrastructure; confirm agreement
- install gate access to field;
- plan storage depot for building materials
- purchase materials, composted soil for beds
- build day/week
